May 12 1831

## King George VII

1. His Majesty the King who is shown wearing his coronation robes is the second son of the late King George VI and was born at York Cottage Sandringham December 14<sup>th</sup> 1895. Served with the Royal Navy during the Great War taking part in the Battle of Jutland and afterwards with the Royal Air Force in France. He was made Duke of York in 1920, and married Lady Elizabeth Bowes-Lyon, daughter of the 14<sup>th</sup> Earl of Strathmore and Kinghorne, in 1923. H. M. was proclaimed King as George VI on December 12<sup>th</sup> 1936 on the abdication of his brother King Edward VIII.

She is a descendant of Robert II who was King of Scotland from 1371-1390 (119 yrs) England has had four Queen Elizabeths the wife of Edward I, the wife of Henry III, Queen Elizabeth I, and now our present Queen. Whereas Duchess of York had already won the hearts of the people by her character and the keen interest she has always shown in every deserving cause.

Westminster Abbey

Westminster Abbey was found by Edward the Confessor <sup>and</sup> has been the scene of the Coronation of all Sovereigns of England since William the Conqueror, except Edward I who was never crowned and Henry III who was crowned at Glouster. Its original form was that of a cross and this has been maintained in spite of many additions and reconstructions. The Abbey contains the Shrine of Edward the Confessor and also Tombs of many Kings and Queens the last being George II.
