THE INHABITANTS: G.B. and Boers describe a treatment of natives. Main theme of hist of S.Af. → 1910.

a) The Boer Farmer, not a town dweller. Took over a stretch of land for his farming. Ruled like a king. Unwilling to fall in with native Govt. Had native slaves, as large stock farms. Regarded O.T. as more inst. than S.T. Calvinists. Read Bible & the Evening & S.T. Regarded a patriarchs of those people living in a promised land. Native inferior. Think land there for them to take. People above for them to enslave.

b) The Natives: Hottentots, at times Europeanised. Mixed bushmen. Yellowish in

colour. Known to prominent by tribe. Nomadic. Soon broke up by impact of Whites. Used for slave labour. Some shared off. Wandered with small herds like Griquas.

Bushmen: just hunters and cattle raiders. Boers regarded them almost as animals. Slaughtered them. Dovin → Kalahari Desert.

The Bantus or Kaffirs: Zulus, Basutos, Matabele, Bechuanas, Thosa lived in the savanna areas. Warlike - belligerent. Formidable fighters. Zulus, Thosakings especially.

c) Cause - Conflict between G.B. and Boers. The Native question.

1. Griqua: a wanderer, who offers -

i Mrs. Fr. L.N.S. - under Dr. Phillips. Criticized the Boers treatment of Natives. Wanted to see them protected from White Man's exploitation. Wrote a book criticizing the Boer treatment. He resulted it. Scornfully wrong. Thought their treatment was O.K.

ii The Ordinances of 1913: Govt of Cape changed.
 a) G.L. replaced w/ local govt instead of Boer.
 b) G.L. regulates admin. G.L. law = local law cont.
 c) G.L. language employed.
 d) In court a Nat. equal to a white man (going up).
 Upset Boers: subjects of alien govt.

In court, equal to a native. Against their religious beliefs.

iii The Abolition of Slavery 1933: G.R. abol.
 slavery. Emancipation Act voted
 " Land Min. Soc.

£29,000,000 as compensation to the slave owners. But, didn't like it for 7 years.
 a) Slavery in S.A.F. only a mild kind. Not brutal like in W. Indies. . . felt penalized for a system which was not their own way.
 b) Though value of £35,000 or £4000+ slaves owned by Boers valued at £1,000,000, only £1,270,000 paid as compensation. Also, less of Slaves meant many Boers couldn't own their farms.

c) Boers opposed to principle of abolition. Thought negroes deserved by God as slaves of white man. Principle of equality, i.e. Emancipation Act flouted ways of Boers.

Thus ab. of SL upset Boers religious and financially.

iv. Kaffer War (1824-5): Kafirs disrupted native service founding of Albany settlement (1820). In Dec '24, invaded Al. Killed British. D'Urban, new G. B. gov, adv → Albany. Cleared Kafirs → Kaffir Territory. By Apr '25, Kafirs beaten. Peace Terms: G. B. annexed a strip of land as far as Great Kei Riv. D'U. wanted it as a buff. state, not col., to pool. Cps. Col.

Boers support settlement.

G. B Col. Sec., Lt. Glenelg, disagreed. Not want to extend G. B Emp. Ordered withdrawal from Kaff. Terr.

2. The Expansion of S.A. Territories:

(a) Barolitoa: 1868: Frequent trouble between
Barolitoa + Q.P.S. Became serious in 1868, and
Markham made protest meetings with S.B. In
1869, Q.P.S. had to act on this behalf, and Karras
to annex Barolitoa. Then asked for help.
S.B. i. promised him. Made a protective
Govt except of recently annexed (1867).

Criquedens West (1871): Got together another
force to annexate now Kimberley 1887. In 1871,
60,000 settlers to Kimberley area. Current
agreement between Griqua + Nama who had
owned Kimberley in disputed area. Until 1873
Tribesman to Kimberley. Claimed Kimberley
belonged to Griqua. No capital? NW offered
to build town with a few houses

G.B to N.S., who offered to accept G.B. authority.
In 1871, T.W. was annexed to C. Zulu B.Ls
paid £90,000 comp & £1,000 p.a.


