I have the honour to inform you that a British Vice-Consulate has been established at Wilmington, North Carolina, under the superintendence of His Majesty's Consul at Baltimore, and that Mr. George Frederick Todd has been appointed to the post as Vice-Consul. I enclose herein a certified copy of the letter of appointment issued to Mr. Todd by His Majesty's Consul at Baltimore, dated the 16th November last, and a biographical record in the usual form. A certified specimen of Mr. Todd's official signature and seal will be forwarded as soon as possible.
