I refer to the Embassy's note no. 346 of September 19, 1938 and to this Government's note of December 17, 1938, in the penultimate paragraph of which it was stated that the question of the Philippine Government's representation on the American Delegation to the conference to be held in London in February 1939, for the purpose of considering a draft convention for the exemption from taxation of liquid fuel and lubricants used in air traffic was being considered and that you would be advised as soon as a decision was reached in the matter.
