With reference to my despatch No. 124 B of February 2nd, I have the honour to transmit to Your Lordship an article by Mr. Walter Lippmann which appeared in his syndicated column to-day and deals with the conflict developing between the President and Congress.

2. Mr. Lippmann has long been out of sympathy with the internal policy of the Administration and his picture is possibly more sombre than the truth. Nevertheless, it presents a view which is being widely expressed by many people who, like Mr. Lippmann, wish to see the United States follow a strong foreign policy, and are alarmed at the disintegration now going on within the Democratic party.
