Press Release No 666:

This seems quite straightforward except for the last sentence. This presumably refers to the fact that aircraft in which the title remains in the U.S. can be flown for a temporary sojourn to Canada. (See McHallett's memorandum of Nov. 14?)

Here it seems that the Neutrality Act forbids the flying over the border of aircraft destined for ~~export~~ belligerents. This is by virtue of 2 a) but the matter is somewhat puzzling since if 2 b) forbids the delivery of aircraft to belligerents because it forbids the "transportation" of aircraft ^(which is listed in the proclamation) it would seem that a temporary sojourn is just as much transportation.
