- 1 Resolved, That a special committee of seven Senators,

- 3 and directed to make a full and complete study and investiga-
- 4 tion of the activities of any person, firm, or corporation acting
- 5 for or on behalf of any foreign nation, by way of propaganda
- 6 or otherwise, having as their ultimate goal or tending to
- 7 cause, directly or indirectly, a change in the neutral position
- 8 of the United States in the conflicts now being waged abroad.
- 9 The committee shall report to the Senate the results of its
- 10 study and investigations, together with its recommendations,
- 11 if any, for necessary legislation.
