I refer to my letter of August 13, 1940 to Lord Lothian, conveying a request of the War Department for permission to take aerial photographs of the central group of the Lesser Antilles and to his aide-mémoire of September 24, granting such authorization. The War Department has now expressed the hope that the British Government may extend the authority already granted to include Jamaica, the Bahama Islands, Newfoundland, Bermuda, British Honduras and Trinidad in view of the probability
