-/2 I refer to Mr. Nevile Butler's despatch No. 27 of the 10th January, and have to approve the arrangements by which the United States Vice-Consul at Guadeloupe, when appointed, should take charge of British interests in the island. I should be glad if he would also assume protection of the consular property.
